HB 43 – Relating to Child Welfare
Ch. 2020-40 Laws of Florida
Signed by the Governor on June 18, 2020

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Requiring the Florida Court Educational Council to establish certain standards for instruction of circuit and county court judges for dependency cases;
- Requiring the Department of Law Enforcement to provide certain information to law enforcement officers relating to specified individuals;
- Requiring Child Protection Teams to be capable of providing certain training relating to head trauma and brain injuries in children younger than a specified age;
- Requiring the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission to establish standards for the instruction of law enforcement officers in a specified subject, etc.

Signed by the Governor on June 27, 2020

- Requiring sheriffs to coordinate with specified entities to develop a comprehensive plan for security of trial court facilities;
- Specifying sheriffs and chief judges retain certain authority;



 Specifying sheriffs and their deputies, employees, and contractors are officers of court under specified circumstances.

- Establishing grant-in-aid program to help continuums of care prevent and end homelessness:
- Providing program requirements.

- Requiring the Division of Emergency Management to create a list of reportable incidents;

- Requiring a political subdivision to report incidents contained on the list to the State Watch Office:
- Authorizing the Division of Emergency Management to establish guidelines a political subdivision must follow to report an incident, etc.

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Specifying that an allegation or complaint of misconduct against a law enforcement officer or a correctional officer may originate from any source;
- Authorizing law enforcement and correctional agencies to request a separate agency to conduct an investigation of a complaint under certain circumstances, etc.

SB 664 - Relating to Verification of Employment Eligibility Ch. 2020-149 Laws of Florida Signed by the Governor on June 30, 2020

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Prohibiting the approval of certain economic development incentive applications after a specified date;
- Requiring public employers, contractors, and subcontractors to register with and use the E-Verify system;
- Prohibiting such entities from entering into a contract unless each party to the contract registers with and uses the E-Verify system;
- Requiring private employers to verify the employment eligibility of newly hired employees beginning on a specified date, etc.

Signed by the Governor on June 27, 2020
SB 1116 was an FDC Priority Bill

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Creating the State-Operated Institutions Inmate Welfare Trust Fund within the Department of Corrections; providing the purpose of the trust fund;
- Providing for future review and termination or re-creation of the trust fund, etc.

SB 1118 - Relating to Inmate Welfare Trust Funds
Ch. 2020-98 Laws of Florida
Signed by the Governor on June 27, 2020
SB 1118 was an FDC Priority Bill

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Requiring that certain amounts in inmate trust fund accounts be deposited into the trust fund;
- Requiring that specified proceeds and funds be deposited into the State-Operated Institutions Inmate Welfare Trust Fund;
- Providing that the trust fund is a trust held by the Department of Corrections for the benefit and welfare of certain inmates;
- Requiring that funds of the trust fund be used exclusively for specified purposes at correctional facilities operated by the department; etc.

SB 1120 - Relating to Substance Abuse Services Ch. 2020-38 Laws of Florida Signed by the Governor on June 18, 2020

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Requiring, rather than authorizing, an exemption from disqualification from employment for certain substance abuse service provider personnel under certain circumstances;
- Providing that certain persons may be granted such exemption without a waiting period under certain circumstances:
- Removing the authority of the Department of Children and Families to grant exemptions from disqualification under Ch. 397, F.S., under certain circumstances;
- Providing criminal penalties for violations relating to recovery residence patient referrals, etc.

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Prohibiting the involuntary placement of pregnant prisoners in restrictive housing;
- Providing exceptions;
- Requiring corrections officials to write a specified report if circumstances necessitate placing a pregnant prisoner in restrictive housing;
- Providing requirements for the treatment of pregnant prisoners placed in restrictive housing;
- Requiring pregnant prisoners to be placed in a designated medical housing unit or admitted to the infirmary under certain circumstances;
- Expanding enforcement provisions to provide for grievances for violations relating to restrictive housing of pregnant prisoners, etc.

- Prohibiting the introduction of certain cannabis related substances and vapor-generating electronic devices inside a state correctional institution, etc.

SB 1292 - Relating to Public Records/Nonjudicial Arrest Record of a Minor
Vetoed by the Governor on June 27, 2020
(SB 1292 was contingent on the passage of SB 700 – Juvenile Justice, which did not pass the Legislature. Therefore, SB 1292 is a nullity.)

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Providing an exemption from public records requirements for a nonjudicial record of the arrest of a minor who has successfully completed a diversion program;
- Providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption under the Open Government Sunset Review Act;
- Providing a statement of public necessity, etc.

- Removing Division of State Technology from, and adding Florida Digital Service and Division of Telecommunications to, Department of Management Services (DMS);
- Requiring Florida Digital Service to develop enterprise architecture; prohibits DMS from retrieving or disclosing data under circumstances;
- Revising certain standards that the Department of Legal Affairs, Department of Financial Services, and Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services must adopt;

- Providing for future legislative review and repeal of exemptions; provides statement of public necessity.

APPROPRIATIONS UPDATE

The following is an overview of the budget for the Florida Department of Corrections (FDC) which was passed by the Florida Legislature during the 2020 Regular Legislative Session.

HB 5001 – Relating to Appropriations
Ch. 2020-111 Laws of Florida
Approved by the Governor with Vetoes on June 29, 2020

Major funding highlights include:

The funding for the Florida Department of Corrections (FDC) is approximately \$2.76 billion including \$2.7 billion in General Revenue, \$61 million in Trust Funds, and 25,154 authorized positions.

The General Appropriations Act for Fiscal Year 2020-2021 and conforming bills include the following for FDC:

Improve Operations and Create Safer Correctional Facilities

- Pay Raise (Oct. 1) All state employees will receive a pay raise of 3% (eligible employees in Career Service, Selected Exempt Service and Senior Management Service), based on their September 30, 2020, base rate of pay.
- Targeted Retention Incentives to Improve Staffing In addition to the 3% increase detailed above, all Correctional Officers (through the rank of Colonel), Correctional



Probation Officers (through the rank of Correctional Probation Senior Supervisor) and Office of Inspector General Inspectors (through the rank of Inspector Supervisor) will receive a retention pay increase starting in October. The retention increase is:

- \$500 for fewer than two years of service,
- \$1,500 for two to five years of service, and
- \$2,500 for five years or more of service.
- 8.5-Hour Shift Pilot Program to Create Safer Conditions \$17.3 Million and 220 FTE (Full-Time Equivalent positions). Implement a pilot program to convert approximately one-fourth of FDC institutions to an 8.5-hour shift (includes compensation for pre- and post-shift briefings). Prior to implementation of the current 12-hour schedule, the Department's institutions and security staff worked an 8-hour schedule. After moving to a 12-hour schedule, FDC has experienced numerous issues directly related to extended shifts, including increases in separations of staff, overtime, staff fatigue, contraband, and more.
- Security Threat Group Sergeants \$2.2 Million and 34 FTE. Provide increased management of Security Threat Group members (gangs) by placing a new Correctional Officer Sergeant position at various facilities statewide.
- Office of Inspector General Inspectors \$736,000 and 10 FTE. Transparency and accountability remain priorities for the Department, and these additional positions will reduce the average criminal and administrative investigation caseload to meet investigative demand.
- Security Enhancement Equipment \$3 Million. Funding needed to purchase, replace, and upgrade critically needed equipment such as netting systems for throw overs, metal detectors, radios, location tracking systems, cell phone detectors, perimeter security systems, ID verification systems, and biometric hand scanners.

Expand Reentry Programming and Reduce Recidivism

- Career and Technical Education \$3 Million. Partnerships with local technical/state
 colleges and industry training expansion for vocational programming. This will help ensure
 inmates return to their communities with job skills and will increase the readiness and skill
 of Florida's workforce.
- Teacher Pay (October 1) In addition to the 3% pay increase detailed above, all
 Academic Teachers, Special Education Teachers, and Education Supervisors I and II will
 receive a 15% increase based on their September 30, 2020, base rate of pay.

Improve Health Services and Inmate Wellness



Effective Date: July 1, 2020

- Wellness Specialists \$1.9 Million and 34 FTE. Reestablish wellness programs at major institutions and annexes. Inmate wellness activities decrease health costs and reduce incidents of disciplinary action by reducing inmate idleness.
- **Electronic Medical Record \$2 Million**. Information technology network infrastructure upgrades that will allow the Department to improve network security, modernize IT systems, and transition to electronic medical records.
- Mental Health Hospital at Lake Correctional Institution 13.8 Million. Investment for the creation of a new mental health facility at Lake CI. This new facility will create staff and building efficiencies and is located near an adequate pool of mental health and security staff.

Address Aging Infrastructure

- Facility Maintenance and Repairs \$6 Million. Address critical repair and renovations at Department facilities statewide.
- Fleet \$2.6 Million. Investment in mission critical vehicles such as transport vans, perimeter security vehicles, or cars used by probation officers for monitoring offenders in the community.

Additionally, SB 1116 and SB 1118 were an FDC priority during the 2020 Regular Legislative Session. These bills reestablish the State-Operated Inmate Welfare Trust Fund and provide an additional \$2.5 million for the benefit and welfare of inmates in state-operated facilities. The trust fund will provide valuable resources that will improve inmate health and well-being, decrease inmate idleness and violence, and reduce recidivism.

- Requiring the Board of Governors and the State Board of Education, in consultation with the Department of Veterans' Affairs, to create a process for the uniform award of postsecondary credit or career education clock hours to certain servicemembers and veterans of the United States Armed Forces;
- Requiring specified postsecondary institutions to waive the transcript fee for active duty members of the United States Armed Forces, certain veterans, and their spouses and dependents, etc.

- Requiring the Department of Transportation to give priority to certain projects;
- Designating the Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) as lead state agency to facilitate expansion of broadband Internet service;
- Requires DEO to work with certain entities; creates Florida Office of Broadband in DEO;
- Provides purpose and duties of office.



- Prohibiting such insurers from taking certain actions relating to genetic information for any insurance purpose.

- Prohibiting homeowners' associations from promulgating certain rules or regulations, etc.

- Prohibiting health care practitioners and certain students from performing a pelvic examination on a patient without first obtaining the written consent of the patient or the patient's legal representative;
- Establishing the criminal offense of reproductive battery, etc.

- Exempting sales, exchanges, or transfers of police vehicles to members of the public for the purposes of collection or display from specified requirements, etc.
